1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide the Shareholders with information in respect of certain resolutions to be proposed at the 2018 AGM for (i) the granting of the Buyback Mandate to the Directors; (ii) the granting of the Issuance Mandate to the Directors; (iii) the

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extension of the Issuance Mandate by adding the number of Shares repurchased by the Company under the Buyback Mandate; (iv) the refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit; and (v) the re-election of the retiring Directors.

2. PROPOSED GRANTING OF THE BUYBACK AND ISSUANCE MANDATES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 10 August 2017, general mandates were granted to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase Shares and to issue new Shares respectively. Subsequently, at the special general meeting of the Company held on 29 November 2017, refreshed general mandate was granted to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to issue new Shares. Such mandates, to the extent not utilized by the date of the 2018 AGM, will lapse at the conclusion of the 2018 AGM.

In order to give the Company the flexibility to repurchase Shares and issue new Shares if and where appropriate, the following ordinary resolutions will be proposed at the 2018 AGM to approve the granting of new general mandates to the Directors:

- (a) to repurchase Shares on the Stock Exchange or on any other stock exchange recognized by the Securities and Futures Commission of Hong Kong and the Stock Exchange, of not exceeding 10% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of such resolution (i.e. a total of 1,271,665,046 Shares on the basis that the issued share capital of the Company of 12,716,650,461 Shares remains unchanged from the Latest Practicable Date to the date of the 2018 AGM) (the “**Buyback Mandate**”);
- (b) to allot, issue or deal with Shares of not exceeding 20% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of passing of such resolution (i.e. a total of 2,543,330,092 Shares on the basis that the issued share capital of the Company of 12,716,650,461 Shares remains unchanged from the Latest Practicable Date to the date of the 2018 AGM) (the “**Issuance Mandate**”); and
- (c) to extend the Issuance Mandate by adding the number of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to and in accordance with the Buyback Mandate.

The Buyback Mandate and the Issuance Mandate will continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company held after the 2018 AGM or any earlier date as referred to in the proposed ordinary resolutions contained in items 8 and 9 of the notice of the 2018 AGM set out on pages 15 to 19 of this circular.

In accordance with the requirements of the Listing Rules, the Company is required to send to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all the requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the granting of the Buyback Mandate. The explanatory statement as required by the Listing Rules in connection with the Buyback Mandate is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

3. PROPOSED REFRESHMENT OF SCHEME MANDATE LIMIT UNDER EXISTING SHARE OPTION SCHEME

The Existing Share Option Scheme was adopted by the Company on 27 September 2013. The purpose of the Existing Share Option Scheme is to enable the Company to grant options to eligible participants as incentives and/or rewards for their contribution to the Group. Apart from the Existing Share Option Scheme, the Company has no other share option scheme currently in force.

Pursuant to Chapter 17 of the Listing Rules, the total number of securities which may be issued upon exercise of all options to be granted under a share option scheme and any other schemes of a listed issuer must not in aggregate exceed 10% of the relevant class of securities of the listed issuer in issue as at the date of approval of the scheme (the “**10% Limit**”). The listed issuer may seek approval by its shareholders in general meeting for “refreshing” the 10% Limit. However, the total number of securities which may be issued upon exercise of all options to be granted under all of the schemes of the listed issuer under the limit as “refreshed” must not exceed 10% of the relevant class of securities in issue as at the date of approval of the refreshed limit. Options previously granted under the schemes (including those outstanding, cancelled or lapsed in accordance with the scheme or exercised options) will not be counted for the purpose of calculating the limit as “refreshed”. The Listing Rules also provide that the limit on the number of securities which may be issued upon exercise of all outstanding options granted and yet to be exercised under the scheme and any other schemes must not exceed 30% of the relevant class of securities of the listed issuer in issue from time to time.

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 10 August 2017, the Scheme Mandate Limit was refreshed and approved by the then Shareholders such that the total number of Shares which may fall to be issued upon exercise of all share options to be granted under the Existing Share Option Scheme and any other share option scheme(s) as may from time to time be adopted by the Company must not exceed 1,073,516,898 Shares. Up to the Latest Practicable Date, options carrying the rights to subscribe for 1,073,464,000 Shares have been granted under the Existing Scheme Mandate Limit, representing approximately 8.44% of the issued share capital of the Company. All of these 1,073,464,000 share options granted under the Existing Scheme Mandate Limit were not yet exercised. The Company is permitted to grant further options to subscribe for 52,898 Shares under the Existing Scheme Mandate Limit, being approximately 0.001% of the issued share capital of the Company as at the Latest Practicable Date.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, total outstanding share options carrying the rights to subscribe for 1,969,464,000 Shares have been granted under Existing Share Option Scheme, representing approximately 15.49% of the existing issued share capital of the Company.

In order to give the Company the flexibility to grant share options to eligible participants under the Existing Share Option Scheme as incentives and/or rewards for their contribution to the Group, the Directors consider that it is in the interests of the Company to refresh the Scheme Mandate Limit. If such refreshment is approved at the 2018 AGM, and assuming that the issued share capital of the Company of 12,716,650,461 Shares remains unchanged from the

Latest Practicable Date to the date of the 2018 AGM, the Company will be allowed under the refreshed limit, to grant up to 1,271,665,046 share options pursuant to the Existing Share Option Scheme, entitling the grantees to subscribe for a total of 1,271,665,046 Shares, representing 10% of the issued Shares as at the date of the 2018 AGM.

The refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit is conditional upon:

- (i) the passing of an ordinary resolution at the 2018 AGM to approve the said refreshment; and
- (ii) the Listing Committee of the Stock Exchange granting the listing of, and permission to deal in any new Shares which may fall to be allotted and issued upon the exercise of the subscription rights attaching to the options that may be granted under the refreshed limit of the Existing Share Option Scheme up to 10% of the total issued Shares as at the date of passing of the relevant ordinary resolution at the 2018 AGM.

An application will be made to the Listing Committee of the Stock Exchange for granting the listing of, and permission to deal in any new Shares which may fall to be allotted and issued upon the exercise of the subscription rights attaching to the options that may be granted under the refreshed limit of the Existing Share Option Scheme.

4. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF THE RETIRING DIRECTORS

Pursuant to the provisions of the Bye-laws, Ms Lam Hay Yin, Mr Chen Youchun and Mr Mai Qijian shall retire at the 2018 AGM and, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the 2018 AGM. Pursuant to Rule 13.74 of the Listing Rules, a listed issuer shall disclose the details required under Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules of any director(s) proposed to be re-elected or proposed new director in the notice or accompanying circular to its shareholders of the relevant general meeting, if such re-election or appointment is subject to shareholders' approval at that relevant general meeting. The requisite details of the above Directors proposed to be re-elected at the 2018 AGM are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

5. 2018 AGM AND PROXY ARRANGEMENT

The notice of the 2018 AGM is set out on pages 15 to 19 of this circular. At the 2018 AGM, resolutions will be proposed to approve, inter alia, the granting of the Buyback Mandate and the Issuance Mandate, the extension of the Issuance Mandate by adding the number of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Buyback Mandate, the refreshment of the Scheme Mandate Limit and the re-election of the retiring Directors.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll. Accordingly, all the proposed resolutions will be put to vote by way of poll at the 2018 AGM. The following is an explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to provide the Shareholders with requisite information reasonably necessary for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the 2018 AGM in relation to the granting of the Buyback Mandate.

1. REASONS FOR BUYBACK OF SHARES

The Directors believe that the granting of the Buyback Mandate is in the interests of the Company and the Shareholders.

Repurchases of Shares may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share. The Directors are seeking the granting of the Buyback Mandate to give the Company the flexibility to do so if and when appropriate. The number of Shares to be repurchased on any occasion and the price and other terms upon which the same are repurchased will be decided by the Directors at the relevant time, having regard to the circumstances then pertaining.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 12,716,650,461 Shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution set out in item 8 of the notice of the 2018 AGM in respect of the granting of the Buyback Mandate and on the basis that the issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged from the Latest Practicable Date to the date of the 2018 AGM, the Directors would be authorized under the Buyback Mandate to repurchase, during the period in which the Buyback Mandate remains in force, a total number of 1,271,665,046 Shares, representing 10% of the total number of issued Shares as at the date of the 2018 AGM.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws, the laws of Bermuda, and/or any other applicable laws, as the case may be.

4. IMPACT OF REPURCHASES

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited accounts contained in the annual report of the Company for the period from 1 April 2017 to 31 December 2017) in the event that the Buyback Mandate was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Buyback Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time befitting the Company.

5. TAKEOVERS CODE

If, on the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Buyback Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code for all the Shares not already owned by such Shareholder or group of Shareholders.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr Huang Chuan was interested in a total of 2,008,610,000 Shares (representing approximately 15.80% of the total issued share capital of the Company) for which 8,610,000 Shares were held personally and 2,000,000,000 Shares were held by Dragon Regal Holdings Limited (a controlled corporation of Mr Huang Chuan), and Mr Chen Xiangru was interested in 1,853,992,000 Shares (representing approximately 14.58% of the total issued share capital of the Company). On the basis that (i) the total issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged from the Latest Practicable Date to the date of the 2018 AGM; and (ii) there is no change in the shareholding of Mr Huang Chuan and Mr Chen Xiangru in the Company immediately prior to and after the full exercise of the Buyback Mandate, in the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares in accordance with the terms of the relevant ordinary resolution to be proposed at the 2018 AGM, the shareholding interest of Mr Huang Chuan and Mr Chen Xiangru in the issued Shares would be increased to approximately 17.55% and 16.20% of the total issued share capital of the Company respectively. The Directors are not aware of any consequences which will arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchases to be made under the Buyback Mandate.

6. GENERAL

None of the Directors or, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their respective close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules) have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the granting of the Buyback Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Company has not been notified by any core connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company that they have a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or that they have undertaken not to sell any Shares held by them to the Company in the event that the granting of the Buyback Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange to exercise the power of the Company to make repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Buyback Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

Ms Lam has not held other directorships in the last three years in public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas.

Length of service

Ms Lam has not been appointed for any fixed term but is subject to retirement and re-election at the annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the By-laws.

Relationships

As far as the Directors are aware, Ms Lam does not have any relationships with any other Directors, senior management, substantial Shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules), or controlling Shareholders (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company.

Interests in Shares

As far as the Directors are aware, as at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms Lam personally held 127,120,000 share options of the Company attaching thereto the rights to subscribe for 127,120,000 Shares, representing approximately 1% of the issued share capital of the Company. (2) Mr Chen Youchun**Position & experience**

Mr Chen Youchun (“**Mr Chen**”), aged 41, is an independent non-executive Director and a member of the Audit Committee, Remuneration Committee and Nomination Committee of the Company. Mr Chen holds degree of Bachelor of Laws from Southwest University of Political Science and Law in 2000 and the University of Northumbria in 2011, and a Master degree in Laws from Wuhan University in 2007. Mr Chen is a foreign lawyer registered with The Law Society of Hong Kong. Mr Chen has extensive experience in corporate financing, private equity, venture capitals, IPO and listing, and mergers and acquisitions. Mr Chen has been a partner of the Shenzhen office of JunZeJun Law Offices since 2006. Mr Chen was an independent director of Shenzhen Century Plaza Hotel Co. Ltd. (a company listed on the Shenzhen Stock Exchange, stock code: 000033) from November 2010 to December 2015, and an independent director of Shenzhen Qixin Construction Group Co. Ltd. (a company listed on the Shenzhen Stock Exchange, stock code: 002781) since December 2015 to September 2017.
