2. GENERAL MANDATES TO REPURCHASE AND ISSUE BY THE COMPANY OF ITS SECURITIES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 29 November 2012, a general mandate was given to the directors of the Company (the “**Director(s)**”) to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase its securities. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting.

An ordinary resolution will be proposed to give a fresh general mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase, for a term and in the terms as stated in the said ordinary resolution, shares of HK\$0.01 each of the Company (the “**Shares**”) in and up to a maximum of 10% of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued share capital of the Company at the date of passing such ordinary resolution (the “**Repurchase Mandate**”).

This appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide the requisite information to you for your consideration of the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at 28 October 2013 (the latest practicable date prior to the printing of this circular, the “**Latest Practicable Date**”), there were in issue an aggregate of 542,262,697 Shares.

Subject to the passing and pursuant to the terms of the ordinary resolution regarding the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting to be held on 5 December 2013, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 54,226,269 Shares.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole. Such repurchase may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets value per share and/or earnings per share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchase will benefit the Company and its Shareholders as a whole.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASE AND MATERIAL ADVERSE IMPACT

In repurchasing Securities, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its Memorandum of Association and Bye-Laws and the laws of Bermuda. The amount of premium payable on repurchase may only be paid out of either the profits that would otherwise be available for dividend or out of the share premium or contributed surplus accounts of the Company.

5. UNDERTAKING AND EFFECT OF REPURCHASE

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate and in accordance with the Listing Rules and the laws of Bermuda.

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, their associates as defined in the Listing Rules, have any present intention to sell any securities of the Company to the Company or its subsidiaries under the Repurchase Mandate if such is approved by the Shareholders.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Chong Sok Un ("**Ms. Chong**") beneficially held 391,125,707 Shares (*Note*), representing approximately 72.13% of the issued share capital of the Company.

In the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares which is proposed to be granted pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate then (if the present Shareholders' interests in Shares remained the same) the attributable shareholding of Ms. Chong in the Company would be increased to approximately 80.14% of the issued share capital of the Company but such increase will not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors are not aware of any consequence which would arise under the Takeovers Code as a consequence of any purchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate. In any event, the Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate if the number of Shares held by the public would fall below 25%.

She has been the chairman of Long Island Golf & Country Club, Dongguan, China since September 1998. Ms. Chong was awarded the Medal of Honour (M.H.) by the Government of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region on 1 July 2011. She is a member of Dongguan Committee of the Chinese People’s Political Consultative Conference, the Honorary Director of the Chinese Red Cross Foundation, Permanent Honorary Chairman of the Hong Kong Federation of Fujian Associations and Vice Chairman of the Hong Kong Federation of Fujian Associations Ladies Committee. She is now the namer and director of YOT Chong Sok Un Medical Fund (cancer aid) and a member of Yan Oi Tong Advisory Board. Ms. Chong was the chairman of the 31st Term of the Board of Directors of Yan Oi Tong 2010-2011. She was a non-executive director of ChinaVision Media Group Limited from 25 June 2007 to 23 April 2009.

Ms. Chong has entered into a service agreement with the Company for a term of two years and the term of her service shall be renewed automatically for successive two-year term or until terminated in accordance with the said service agreement. Her appointment is also subject to the relevant provisions of retirement and re-election at the annual general meetings of the Company in accordance with the Bye-laws or any other applicable laws whereby she shall vacate her office. Ms. Chong is entitled to receive a monthly remuneration of HK\$35,000, one month year-end double pay and performance based discretionary bonus. Her remuneration is determined with reference to market rates and her duties and responsibilities in the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Chong is deemed to have corporate interest in 391,125,707 Shares of the Company held through Vigor Online Offshore Limited (“**Vigor**”) within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance. Vigor is a wholly-owned subsidiary of China Spirit Limited in which Ms. Chong maintains 100% beneficial interest.

Save as disclosed above, Ms. Chong did not hold any directorship in other listed public companies in Hong Kong or overseas in the last three years and does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management, substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

(ii) **Mr. Lau Siu Ki (“Mr. Lau”)**

Mr. Lau Siu Ki, aged 55, was appointed as independent non-executive director of the Company on 3 June 2004. He has over 30 years of experience in corporate finance, financial advisory and management, accounting and auditing. He is currently working as a consultant in the financial advisory field. Prior to that, Mr. Lau had worked in an international accounting firm for over 15 years. He is a fellow member of both the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (“ACCA”) as well as the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Mr. Lau was a member of the Council of ACCA and a member of the Committee of the Hong Kong branch of ACCA. He was also the Chairman of ACCA Hong Kong for the year 2000/2001. Mr. Lau is also the independent non-executive director of Binhai Investment Company Limited, Comba Telecom Systems Holdings Limited, TCL Communication Technology Holdings Limited, Foxconn International Holdings Limited, Samson Holding Ltd. and Embry Holdings Limited. He was an independent non-executive director of Carry Wealth Holdings Limited from 20 February 2002 to 13 July 2011.

Mr. Lau has served on the board of directors of the Company (the “**Board**”) as an Independent Non-Executive Director for more than nine years and, during such tenure, he has given independent guidance and advice to the Company. The Company has received from Mr. Lau his annual confirmation of independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules.

The Board is satisfied that Mr. Lau remains independent, and considers that Mr. Lau would be able to continue to discharge his duties as an independent non-executive director of the Company and should be re-elected at the Annual General Meeting, particularly in view of his extensive experience and valuable contribution to the Board.
