1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with the AGM Notice and the information on the Resolutions that will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting for the Shareholders to consider and, if thought fit, to approve (a) the granting of the General Mandates and the extension of the Share Issue Mandate to the Board; and (b) the re-election of the retiring Directors.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

2. PROPOSED GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 28 April 2008 at Room 2502, Alexandra House, 18 Chater Road, Central, Hong Kong, resolutions were passed granting the Directors a general mandate to allot, issue or deal with additional Shares up to a maximum of 20 per cent of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued Shares as at the date of such meeting and a general mandate to repurchase on the Stock Exchange up to 10 per cent of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued Shares at the date of such meeting. The general mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares was extended by an amount representing the aggregate nominal amount of the Shares so repurchased. Such mandates will expire at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. It is therefore proposed that the Company will seek the approval of the Shareholders of the relevant resolutions proposed at the Annual General Meeting in respect of the renewal of the respective general mandates to issue, allot and deal with Shares and to repurchase Shares.

At the Annual General Meeting, Resolutions will be proposed that the Directors be given the General Mandates. In addition, a Resolution will also be proposed at the Annual General Meeting providing that any Shares repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate (up to a maximum of 10 per cent of the aggregate nominal amount of the issued Shares as at the date of the grant of the Repurchase Mandate) will be added to the total number of Shares which may be allotted and issued under the Share Issue Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 1,739,565,172 Shares. Subject to the passing of the resolutions granting the General Mandates and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed to issue a maximum of 347,913,034 Shares.

Each of the General Mandates would continue in force until whichever is the earliest of: (a) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company; (b) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles of Association or any applicable laws of the Cayman Islands to be held; or (c) the date on which any such mandate is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

The Explanatory Statement, which is required by the Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders, is set out in Appendix I to this circular. It contains information reasonably necessary to enable you to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolution to grant the Directors the Repurchase Mandate.

3. PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF THE RETIRING DIRECTORS

The Board currently consists of nine Directors including five executive Directors, namely, Mr. Wang Boming (Chariman), Mr. Zhang Zhifang, Mr. Dai Xiaojing, Mr. Li Shijie and Ms. Wu Chuan Hui Daphne and four independent non-executive Directors, namely, Mr. Fu Fengxiang, Mr. Wang Xiangfei, Mr. Ding Yu Cheng and Mr. Zhang Ke.

Pursuant to Articles 119 and 120 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Dai Xiaojing, Mr. Ding Yu Cheng and Mr. Zhang Ke shall retire as Directors and be eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting. In addition, pursuant to Article 127 of the Articles of Association, Ms. Wu Chuan Hui Daphne, being a Director appointed by the Board after the Company's last annual general meeting held on 28 April 2008, will hold office only until the Annual General Meeting and shall be eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Pursuant to Rule 13.74 of the Listing Rules, details of Mr. Dai Xiaojing, Ms. Wu Chuan Hui Daphne, Mr. Ding Yu Cheng and Mr. Zhang Ke are set out in Appendix II hereto.

4. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

At the Annual General Meeting, Resolutions will be proposed to approve, among other things, (a) the granting of the General Mandates to the Board; (b) the extension of the Share Issue Mandate to the Board by the addition of the number of shares repurchased pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate; (c) the re-election of Mr. Dai Xiaojing and Ms. Wu Chuan Hui Daphne as executive Directors; and Mr. Ding Yu Cheng and Mr. Zhang Ke as independent non-executive Directors.

A form of proxy is enclosed for your use at the Annual General Meeting. You are requested to complete and return the form of proxy to the Company's branch share registrar in Hong Kong, Tricor Secretaries Limited, at 26/F Tesbury Centre, 28 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong as soon as possible, but in any event not later than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the Annual General Meeting or any adjournment thereof. Completion and return of a form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting in person at the Annual General Meeting or any adjournment thereof should you so wish and in such event the form of proxy shall be deemed to be revoked.

Resolutions shall be determined by poll pursuant to the Listing Rules.

5. RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT

This circular includes particulars given in compliance with the Listing Rules for the purpose of giving information with regard to the Group. The Directors collectively and individually accept full responsibility for the accuracy of the information contained in this circular and confirm, having made all reasonable enquiries, that to the best of their knowledge and belief there are no facts the omission of which would make any statement herein misleading.

6. RECOMMENDATION

The Directors consider that the granting of the General Mandates, the extension of the Share Issue Mandate to the Board and the re-election of the retiring Directors are in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders as a whole. The Directors therefore recommend you to vote in favour of the Resolutions at the Annual General Meeting. The Directors will exercise their voting rights in respect of their shareholdings (if any) in favour of the Resolutions.

This Appendix contains the particulars that are required by the Listing Rules to be included in an explanatory statement to enable the Shareholders to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the Resolutions in relation to the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 1,739,565,172 Shares. Subject to the passing of the resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased before the Annual General Meeting, the Company will be allowed to repurchase a maximum of 173,956,517 Shares during the period ending on the earliest of the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company or the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by the Articles of Association or any applicable laws of the Cayman Islands to be held or the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting.

2. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders to seek a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Company to repurchase the Shares on the Stock Exchange. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value of the Company and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

3. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases made pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be funded out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company's memorandum of association and the Articles of Association and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

The Directors have no present intention to repurchase any Shares and they would only exercise the power to repurchase in circumstances where they consider that the repurchase would be in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders and in circumstances where they consider that the Shares can be repurchased on terms favourable to the Company. On the basis of the consolidated financial position of the Company as at 31 December 2008, being the date to which the latest published audited financial statements of the Company were made up, the Directors consider that if the Repurchase Mandate was to be exercised in full at the current prevailing market value, it would have a material adverse impact on the working capital position and gearing position of the Company. The Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company as compared with the position disclosed in the latest published audited financial statements or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

5. GENERAL

To the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, none of the Directors nor any of their associates currently intend to sell any Shares to the Company if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws and regulations of Hong Kong and the Cayman Islands.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, no connected person (as defined in the Listing Rules) has notified the Company that he has a present intention to sell any Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to do so, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

If, as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the interest of the Shareholder(s), could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

To the best of the knowledge of the Directors, in the event that the Directors exercise in full of the Repurchase Mandate (see Note ii above), then the shareholding of United Home Limited in the Company would be increased to approximately 54.03 per cent of the issued share capital of the Company. Such increase would give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. At present, the Directors do not intend to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as will give rise to such obligation.

During the period since its last annual general meeting held on 28 April 2008 to the Latest Practicable Date, the Company has not repurchased (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) any Shares.

1. MR. DAI XIAOJING, EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Mr. Dai, aged 49, joined the Group in December 1998. He graduated from Guangzhou Zhong Shan University with a bachelor's degree in science and a master's degree in laws, in 1981 and 1984, respectively. He was engaged in economic policy research at the Economic Development Research Institute of State Council of PRC from 1984 to 1989. He has been the an editorial committee member of Capital Week (formerly Security Market Weekly) since 1990 and is also the chairman of Shanghai SEEC Investment Development Company Ltd.

Save as the directorship with the Company, Mr. Dai has not held any other directorship in any listed public companies in the last three years. Save that Mr. Dai is a director and a shareholder of United Home Limited, a controlling shareholder of the Company, Mr. Dai is not connected with any Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Dai is interested in the underlying shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance as follows:

Ms. Wu Chuan Hui Daphne, aged 40, is responsible for the business operation and management of Caijing magazine. Ms. Wu has over ten years of experience in the media industry, first as a journalist, then in business development and management capacity. Before she became the general manager of Caijing magazine in 2006, she was the vice president of the business development of the Company, overseeing the Group's media development and investments in PRC. Ms. Wu holds a master degree in business administration from Fordham University in the United States of America and a bachelor degree of literature from Wuhan University in PRC. Ms. Wu has been appointed as an executive Director from June 2008.

Save as the directorship of the Company, Ms. Wu has not held any other directorship in any listed public companies in the last three years and is not connected with any Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Wu is interested in the underlying shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance as follows:

Mr. Ding holds a master of business administration degree from the University of Pittsburg and a doctor of philosophy degree in economics from Tsinghua University. Mr. Ding is also a non-executive director of Asia Satellite Telecommunications Holdings Limited which is listed on the stock exchanges in Hong Kong and New York. During the period between 3 June 2004 and 15 November 2004, Mr. Ding was an executive director of Tidetime Sun (Group) Limited (previously known as Sun Sports Media Group Limited and Sun Media Group Holdings Limited) which is listed on the stock exchange of Hong Kong. Mr. Ding has been appointed as an independent non-executive Director since June 2005.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Ding has not held any other directorship in any listed public companies in the last three years and is not connected with any Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Ding is not interested in any Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance.

Mr. Ding has not entered into any service contract with the Company. The appointment of Mr. Ding is not for a specified term except that he is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election in accordance with the provisions of the Articles of Association. Mr. Ding received director's remuneration of HK\$180,000 from the Group during the year ended 31 December 2008 which was determined by reference to his duties and responsibilities to the Group.

There is no information to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements set out in rule 13.51(2) (h)-(v) of the Listing Rules in respect of Mr. Ding and save as disclosed herein, there are no other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders in respect of Mr. Ding re-election.

Mr. Zhang is the Chairman of the board of directors and the Chief partner of Shinewing Certified Public Accountants; Vice President of China Institute of Certified Public Accountants; honorary professor in the Accounting department of Renmin University of China; a member of CPA examination committee of the Ministry of Finance; director of China Mergers and Acquisitions Association; and was the Departmental Manager of China International Economic Consultants Inc. of CITIC Group; the Deputy Managing Director of CITIC Certified Public Accountant; Deputy Managing Partner of Coopers & Lybrand CIEC; a partner of Coopers & Lybrand International; Managing Partner of Coopers & Lybrand CIEC, Vice Executive Director of Coopers & Lybrand, China.
