1. INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to provide you with information regarding resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting of the Company to be held on Friday, 23 August 2019. These include (i) the ordinary resolutions granting the Directors general mandates to issue and repurchase Shares and extension of general mandates to issue additional Shares; and (ii) the ordinary resolutions proposing re-election of Directors who are due to retire at the Annual General Meeting.

2. GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 24 August 2018, an ordinary resolution was passed by the then Shareholders granting the existing Repurchase Mandate to the Directors, which is due to expire at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to grant to the Directors a fresh Repurchase Mandate i.e. a general and unconditional mandate to repurchase Shares subject to the maximum number of Shares of up to 10% of the total number of Shares in issue at the date of passing of such resolution. The fresh Repurchase Mandate will remain in effect until the earliest of (i) the date of the next annual general meeting; (ii) the date by which the next annual general meeting is required to be held by the Bye-laws or any other applicable laws; and (iii) the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company.

Under the Listing Rules, the Company is required to give to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the resolution to grant to the Directors the Repurchase Mandate. The explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

3. GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

At the annual general meeting of the Company held on 24 August 2018, an ordinary resolution was passed by the then Shareholders granting the existing Issue Mandate to the Directors, which is due to expire at the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to grant to the Directors a fresh Issue Mandate i.e. a general and unconditional mandate to allot, issue and deal with additional Shares with an aggregate number of Shares not exceeding 20% of the total number of Shares in issue at the date of the passing of such resolution. On the basis of a total of 1,046,474,025 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming no further Shares will be issued or bought back prior to the Annual General Meeting, the maximum number of Shares which may fall to be issued under this proposed Issue Mandate will be 209,294,805 Shares. The fresh Issue Mandate will remain in effect until the earliest of (i) the date of the next annual general meeting; (ii) the date by which the next annual general meeting is required to be held by the Bye-laws or any other applicable laws; and (iii) the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in a general meeting of the Company.

4. GENERAL EXTENSION MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES

An ordinary resolution will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to extend the Issue Mandate by the addition to the aggregate numbers of Shares which may be allotted or agreed conditionally or unconditionally to be allotted by the Directors pursuant to such general mandate of a number of Shares representing the total number

of Shares repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate provided that such extended number shall not exceed 10% of the total number of Shares in issue on the date of passing the resolution approving the Issue Mandate.

5. RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

In accordance with Bye-law 110(A) of the Bye-laws, Professor Lawrence Wu Chi Man and Mr. Wallace Kwan Chi Kin will retire by rotation at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

Professor Wu, aged 60, was appointed an independent non-executive director in 2005 and by the forthcoming Annual General Meeting will have served nearly 14 years. Professor Wu has been known to the Company and the Board in this capacity since he joined the Board. Professor Wu has notified the Board that he would like to be considered for re-election as an independent non-executive director of the Company. In considering the re-election of Professor Wu, the Nomination Committee undertook the following:-

- reviewed and re-assessed Professor Wu's background, expertise and experience according to (i) the board diversity policies of the Company; (ii) the current board composition of the Company and (iii) the strategic objectives of the Group
- considered Professor Wu's past and future contributions and support to the Board
- reviewed and assessed Professor Wu's attendance at board meetings, committee meetings and general meetings
- considered if Professor Wu is able to devote sufficient time to discharge his duties and responsibilities

Professor Wu does not serve on the board of any other listed company and the Board believes that he will be able to devote sufficient time to serve as an independent non-executive director of the Company.

Professor Wu is a materials and structural engineer and has over 30 years of experience in academia and has lived and studied abroad. He is a Fellow of the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers. He has published over 600 technical reports and research reports on materials science and structural engineering. His current research interest includes optical methods in sensors to detect biochemical substances, with applications in medical science, energy harvesting and environmental monitoring. Coming from an academic non-commercial background and with technical professional training, Professor Wu is able to bring diversity to the Board.

Professor Wu has confirmed his independence as regards each of the factors referred to in Rules 3.13(1) to (8) of the Listing Rules; he does not have any past or present financial or other interest in the business of the Company or its subsidiaries or

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any connection with any core connected person (as defined under the Listing Rules); and there are no other factors that may affect his independence. Therefore, the Board has no reason to believe that Professor Wu is not independent and proposes his re-election as an independent non-executive director.

The particulars of those Directors offering themselves for re-election which are required to be disclosed by the Listing Rules are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

General Information

The ordinary resolutions mentioned above are set out in full in the notice of Annual General Meeting set out on pages 13 to 17 of this circular. This Appendix serves as an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide information to you with regard to the Repurchase Mandate.

1. THE LISTING RULES

The Listing Rules provide that all proposed repurchases of shares by a company with a primary listing on the Stock Exchange must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution of Shareholders, either by way of general mandate or by specific approval of a particular transaction.

2. SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the number of Shares in issue is 1,046,474,025 Shares. Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting, exercise in full of the Repurchase Mandate could accordingly result in up to 104,647,402 Shares, representing not more than 10 per cent of the total number of Shares in issue as at the date of passing the relevant resolution granting the Repurchase Mandate, being repurchased by the Company during the period in which the Repurchase Mandate remains in force.

3. REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that the Repurchase Mandate is in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole, which gives the Company flexibility to repurchase Shares in the market if and when appropriate. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net value of the Company and its assets and/or its earnings per Share. Such repurchases will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases will benefit the Company and its Shareholders as a whole.

4. FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases of Shares will be funded entirely from the Company's available cash flow or working capital facilities, which will be funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the Bye-laws and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

There might be a material adverse effect on the working capital or gearing position of the Company upon full exercise of the Repurchase Mandate at any time during the proposed purchase period as compared with the position disclosed in the most recent published audited financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

5. GENERAL

None of the Directors or, to the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders. No core connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, they will only exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

If as a result of a share repurchase, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder, or a group of Shareholders acting in concert (within the meaning under the Takeovers Code) could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Chumphol Kanjanapas held 549,341,014 Shares, representing approximately 52.49% of the total issued share capital of the Company. Assuming Mr. Chumphol Kanjanapas' shareholding remains unchanged, full exercise by the Directors of the Repurchase Mandate will result in an increase of his interests to approximately 58.33% of the reduced issued share capital of the Company immediately after full exercise of the Repurchase Mandate. Such increase may give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory general offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors have no present intention to exercise the power of the Company to repurchase Shares to such an extent as would trigger the Takeovers Code or result in the number of Shares in public hands falling below 25 per cent.

Save as aforesaid, the Directors are not aware of any consequences which could arise under the Takeovers Code as a consequence of any repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate.

Mr. Kwan holds a Bachelor of Social Science Degree from The Chinese University of Hong Kong. He also holds a Master of Business Administration Degree from the University of Manchester and a Master of Laws in Corporate & Financial Law from The University of Hong Kong. He is a member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants and also a fellow of the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants. Mr. Kwan has around 27 years of experience in financial management having worked at an international audit firm and listed companies.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Kwan is not related to any other directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company. He does not have any other directorships in listed companies other than the Company for the last 3 years.

Mr. Kwan's proposed re-appointment as an executive director will be for a term of 3 years subject to retirement by rotation according to the Company's Bye-law 110(A), whichever is the earlier.

Subject to approval by the Shareholders at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting, Mr. Kwan will be entitled to an annual director's fee of HK\$80,000. Professor Wu has published over 600 technical reports and research reports on material science and structural engineering.

Save for the relationship arising from Professor Wu's position as an independent non-executive director of the Company, Professor Wu is not related to any other directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company. He does not have any other directorships in listed companies other than the Company for the last 3 years.

Professor Wu's proposed re-appointment as an independent non-executive director will be for a term of 3 years subject to retirement by rotation according to the Company's Bye-law 110(A), whichever is the earlier. The director's fee paid to Professor Wu for the financial year ended 31 March 2019 is HK\$135,000.00. Save for the director's fee, Professor Wu is not entitled to any other emoluments for the financial year ended 31 March 2019.

The Company's Bye-laws 78, 79 and 80 set out the procedure by which Shareholders may demand a poll:

1. Bye-law 78

At any general meeting a resolution put to the vote of the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands unless a poll is otherwise required to be taken under the Listing Rules or a poll is (before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands or on the withdrawal of any other demand for a poll) demanded:–
