2. GENERAL MANDATES TO ISSUE AND REPURCHASE SHARES

At the AGM, separate ordinary resolutions will be proposed to seek the approval of the Shareholders to grant to the Directors general and unconditional mandates to:

- (a) allot, issue and deal with Shares not exceeding 20% of the total number of Shares in issue (excluding treasury shares, if any) as at the date of passing of the resolution approving the Issue Mandate and authorising the addition to the mandate to allot, issue and deal with further Shares, of such Shares (if any) repurchased by the Company pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate referred to the sub-paragraph (b) below; and
- (b) repurchase Shares not exceeding 10% of the total number of Shares in issue (excluding treasury shares, if any) as at the date of passing of the resolution approving the Repurchase Mandate.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprises 249,182,030 Shares. On the basis that no further Shares will be issued or repurchased following the Latest Practicable Date and prior to the date of AGM, the Company will be allowed to issue a maximum of 49,836,406 Shares under the Issue Mandate, and to repurchase a maximum of 24,918,203 Shares under the Repurchase Mandate, representing not more than 20% and 10% of the total number of Shares in issue (excluding treasury shares, if any) respectively as at the date of passing of such resolutions.

Each of them, being eligible, will offer herself/himself for re-election at the AGM as an executive Director and an independent non-executive Director respectively for a term of three years.

The Nomination Committee has assessed the independence of all independent non-executive Directors and is of the view that all of them have satisfied the independence criteria as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. To the best knowledge of the Directors, as at the Latest Practicable Date, the Company is not aware of any matters or events that may occur and affect the independence of all independent non-executive Directors.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

The Nomination Committee has considered the structure, size, composition and diversity of the Board, the expertise and experience of Ms. Yau On Yee, Annie and Mr. Chow Chee Wai, Christopher in accordance with the Company's Board Diversity Policy and Director Nomination Policy, and recommended them to stand for re-election at the AGM. The Board has accepted the nomination by the Nomination Committee and recommends the re-election of Ms. Yau On Yee, Annie and Mr. Chow Chee Wai, Christopher be proposed for Shareholders' approval at the AGM.

The particulars of Ms. Yau On Yee, Annie and Mr. Chow Chee Wai, Christopher are set out in Appendix II hereto.

4. AGM AND PROXY ARRANGEMENT

This Appendix I serves an explanatory statement, as required by the Listing Rules, to provide the Shareholders with requisite information for them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the ordinary resolution to be proposed at the AGM in relation to the Repurchase Mandate.

1. SHARES IN ISSUE

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there are a total number of 249,182,030 Shares in issue and the Company did not have any treasury shares.

Subject to the passing of the ordinary resolution in respect of the granting of the Repurchase Mandate and on the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the AGM, the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 24,918,203 Shares, representing 10% of the 249,182,030 Shares in issue (excluding treasury shares, if any) as at the date of the AGM, during the period ending on the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting, or (ii) the date upon which such authority given under the Repurchase Mandate is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders.

2. REASONS FOR SHARE REPURCHASE

The Directors believe that it is in the best interests of the Company and the Shareholders for the Directors to have a general authority from the Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase Shares. Such repurchase may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net assets value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made in circumstances when the Directors believe that such repurchase will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

3. FUNDING OF SHARE REPURCHASE

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with its Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws, the laws of Bermuda, and other applicable laws.

The Company is empowered by its Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws to repurchase its Shares. The laws of Bermuda provide that payment for share repurchase may only be made out of the capital paid up on the relevant shares, or funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or the proceeds of a fresh issue of Shares made for such purpose. The amount of premium payable on repurchase may only be paid out of funds of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution or out of the share premium account of the Company before the Shares are repurchased. It is proposed that any repurchase of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be funded out of the capital paid up on the repurchased Shares, fund of the Company which would otherwise be available for dividend or distribution and, where appropriate, the Company's share premium account.

The Stock Exchange published its consultation conclusions on “Proposed Amendments to Listing Rules Relating to Treasury Shares” on 12 April 2024 and the relevant amendments to the Listing Rules (“Amendments”) came into effect on 11 June 2024. As the Amendments were only recently introduced, the Company would like to observe the development of market practices and regulatory guidance before taking benefits from the flexibility provided under the Amendments. Hence, the Company’s present intention is that any Shares bought back under the Repurchase Mandate would be cancelled rather than held as treasury shares. If there is any deviation from this intention statement, the Company will provide its reasons in the next day disclosure return and ensure compliance with the Listing Rules and the laws of the Bermuda.

In addition, under the laws of the Bermuda, no repurchase of Shares may be effected if, on the date on which the repurchase is to be effected, there are reasonable grounds for believing that the Company is, or after the repurchase would be, unable to pay its liabilities as they become due.

4. IMPACT OF SHARE REPURCHASE

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or the gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in the audited financial statements contained in the annual report of the Company for the year ended 31 March 2024) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate was to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements or the gearing position which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

6. DIRECTORS' UNDERTAKING AND CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge and having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their respective close associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), has any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company in the event that the granting of the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

No core connected person of the Company has notified the Company that he/she has a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or has undertaken not to sell any Shares held by him/her to the Company in the event that the granting of the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the powers of the Company to make repurchase pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate and in accordance with its Memorandum of Association and Bye-laws, the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Bermuda.

7. EFFECTS OF TAKEOVERS CODE

If on the exercise of the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of Rule 32 of the Takeovers Code. As a result, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, to the best of the knowledge and belief of the Directors, Ms. Yau On Yee, Annie (an executive Director) together with her Associates, Mr. Tse Tat Fung, Tommy ("Mr. Tse", the spouse of Ms. Yau On Yee, Annie) and Partner Logistics Limited, are deemed to be interested in 180,827,547 Shares, representing approximately 72.57% of the issued share capital of the Company. Partner Logistics Limited is owned and controlled by Blink Technology Limited, which is wholly and beneficially owned by Mr. Tse.

In the event that the Directors exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares under the Repurchase Mandate, then (assuming the present shareholdings remain the same) Ms. Yau On Yee, Annie and her Associates would be interested in approximately 80.63% of the issued share capital of the Company.

The Directors believe that such increase will not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code, but the number of Shares held in the hands of the public may fall below 25%, the minimum public float requirement pursuant to Rule 8.08 of the Listing Rules. At present, the Directors have no intention of exercising the power to repurchase Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would result in the number of Shares held in the hands of the public below 25% of the Company's total number of issued Shares. The Company will comply with the public float requirement under the Listing Rules.

8. SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company has not repurchased any Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

This Appendix II contains the particulars (as required by the Listing Rules) of the retiring Directors proposed to be re-elected at the AGM.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Ms. Yau On Yee, Annie (“**Ms. Yau**”), aged 53, is the Chairman, the Chief Executive Officer, the chairman of the Executive Committee and a member of both the Remuneration Committee and the Nomination Committee of the Company. She joined the Group in 2002, and became an executive Director in 2006. She is also a director of most subsidiaries of the Company.

In the early years at the Company, Ms. Yau pioneered the Group’s Jewellery ERP discipline and modernized the Company’s management through business process re-engineering. Prior to joining the Group, she worked for multi-national companies such as Motorola Semiconductors and IBM. She has over 31 years of management experience in the USA and Hong Kong. She graduated from Boston University, USA and holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Engineering.

Ms. Yau is a director of each of Partner Logistics Limited and Blink Technology Limited which have discloseable interests in the Company under provisions of the SFO. Ms. Yau is the spouse of Mr. Tse Tat Fung, Tommy, the Deputy Chief Executive Officer and the Controlling Shareholder of the Group, and the daughter-in-law of Mr. Tse Sui Luen, the Founder of the Group.

Ms. Yau is currently a member of the 2021 Election Committee of the HKSAR (Wholesale and Retail Subsector), the chairman of Hong Kong Retail Management Association, a nominated member of Hong Kong Brand Development Council, and the convenor of Retail Industry Consultative Networks of Employees Retraining Board. She is also a standing committee member of the Eighth Chinese People’s Political Consultative Conference of Hainan Province, and a member of Hainan-Hong Kong Economic Cooperation and Development Advisory Committee, Jewellery Industry Training Advisory Committee and the Council for Carbon Neutrality and Sustainable Development. She was appointed as an advisory group member of Digital Transformation Support Pilot Programme under Cyberport with effect from 25 September 2023, a member of the Sub-Committee on Youth And Capacity Building under the Council for Carbon Neutrality and Sustainable Development with effect from 1 December 2023 and a member of Tourism Strategy Committee of Culture, Sports and Tourism Bureau with effect from 22 January 2024.

There will be a service contract entered into between the Company and Ms. Yau for a term of three years. She will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the AGM in accordance with the Bye-laws. The remuneration of Ms. Yau will be determined by the Remuneration Committee with reference to the Company’s performance and profitability, as well as the remuneration benchmark in the industry and the prevailing market conditions. For the year ended 31 March 2024, the total remuneration paid to Ms. Yau was HK\$4,460,792 which comprises salaries and allowance. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Ms. Yau was interested in 180,827,547 Shares (representing 72.57% of the issued share capital of the Company).

Save as disclosed above, Ms. Yau has not held any directorships in other listed public companies in the last three years and does not have any other relationship with any directors, senior management or any Substantial or Controlling Shareholders of the Company and did not have any other interests in any Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

In relation to the re-election of Ms. Yau as an executive Director, save as disclosed hereof, there is no other information to be disclosed pursuant to the requirements of Rule 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter that needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

INDEPENDENT NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Mr. Chow Chee Wai, Christopher (“**Mr. Chow**”), aged 57, is an Independent Non-executive Director, the chairman of both the Audit Committee and the Remuneration Committee and a member of the Nomination Committee of the Company, who joined the Group in 2013.

Mr. Chow is the Founding Partner of TCC Capital, an advisory and private equity fund management company. He holds a Diploma of Investment and Finance from The Securities Institute of Australia, a Bachelor of Economics degree from The University of Sydney and is an associate member of the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants. Mr. Chow has over 20 years’ experience in auditing and merger and acquisition advisory. Prior to founding TCC Capital, he worked for two of the “Big Four” international accounting firms in Sydney, Hong Kong and Beijing and was the Partner in charge of the mergers and acquisitions practice. He possesses in-depth understanding of financial and capital markets and has built up substantial experience in advising multinational companies, state owned enterprises and private companies in Hong Kong and Mainland China on a number of direct investments, and mergers and acquisitions transactions.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Chow has not held any directorship in other listed public companies in the last three years and does not have any relationship with any directors, senior management, Substantial Shareholders or Controlling Shareholders of the Company and did not have any interest in any Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There will be a service contract entered into between the Company and Mr. Chow for a term of three years. He will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the AGM in accordance with the Bye-laws. Pursuant to the said service contract, Mr. Chow is entitled to a fixed director’s fee of HK\$216,000 per annum in consideration of the prevailing market condition and the reference to the level of fee normally payable by a listed public company in Hong Kong to an independent non-executive director.

Mr. Chow will have served the Board for more than 11 years at the time of AGM. The Board has received from Mr. Chow annual confirmation of his independence every year and taking into account the various matters as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and his actual contributions, his impartiality and independent judgement on various issues that he brings to the discussions during Board and Board committees meetings, the Board is satisfied with his independence and considers Mr. Chow continues to be independent.

The Nomination Committee has taken into account the skill mix of the Board, the professional knowledge, experience, time commitment and contribution of Mr. Chow, with reference to the nomination criteria and process set out in the Company's Board Diversity Policy and Director Nomination Policy as well as the Company's corporate strategy. The Board also believes that Mr. Chow, through his experience in auditing and merger and acquisition advisory, would contribute significantly to the strategy development and the continuous improvement on internal controls and other relevant financial and corporate governance matters of the Company. Therefore, the Board accepted the nomination from the Nomination Committee and recommended Mr. Chow to stand for re-election by Shareholders at the AGM.
