Taking the lead to establish a knowledge-exchange platform to nurture creative talents for the luxury industry

The Programme consists of ten sessions during which students will participate in both in-class and out-of-class activities. It combines lectures, case studies, firm visit and renowned guest-speaker sharing. Interactive communication with the distinguished speakers will enable students to get an all-round understanding about the application of creativity in the real world business management.
