**GENERAL MANDATE TO ISSUE SHARES**

At the last annual general meeting of Yuexiu Property Company Limited (“Company”) held on 9 June 2011 (“2011 AGM”), a general mandate was given to the directors of the Company (“Directors”) to allot, issue and deal with shares of HK\$0.10 each in the capital of the Company (“Share(s)"). Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the forthcoming annual general meeting to be held on 6 June 2012 at 11:00 a.m. at Plaza IV, Lower Lobby, Novotel Century Hong Kong, 238 Jaffe Road, Wanchai, Hong Kong (“2012 AGM”). In order to ensure flexibility and discretion to the Directors in the event that it becomes desirable to issue any Shares, approval is being sought from the shareholders of the Company (“Shareholders”) at the 2012 AGM to grant a general mandate unconditionally to the Directors to allot or issue new Shares equal in aggregate up to 20 per cent of the issued share capital of the Company at the date of passing the proposed ordinary resolution (“General Mandate”) (i.e. a maximum of 1,857,051,731 Shares assuming that no further Shares are

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issued prior to the date of the 2012 AGM). The obtaining of the General Mandate is in accordance with the Rules Governing the Listing of Securities on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (“Listing Rules”). The proposed resolution (“General Mandate Resolution”) is set out as Ordinary Resolution 5B in the Notice of the 2012 AGM dated 27 April 2012 (“2012 AGM Notice”), which is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

Concerning the General Mandate Resolution, the Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plans to issue any new Shares. Approval is being sought from the Shareholders as a general mandate for the purposes of Section 57B of the Companies Ordinance (Chapter 32 of the Laws of Hong Kong) (“Companies Ordinance”) and the Listing Rules.

### **GENERAL MANDATE TO REPURCHASE OF SHARES**

The Listing Rules permit companies with a primary listing on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (“Stock Exchange”) to repurchase their own securities on the Stock Exchange, subject to certain restrictions. At the 2011 AGM, a general mandate was given to the Directors to repurchase Shares. Such mandate will lapse at the conclusion of the 2012 AGM. Therefore, an ordinary resolution (as set out in Resolution 5A (“Repurchase Mandate Resolution”) in the 2012 AGM Notice, which is set out in Appendix II to this circular) will be proposed to grant to the Directors an unconditional general mandate to, inter alia, repurchase up to 10 per cent of the aggregate nominal amount of the share capital of the Company in issue as at the date of passing of the Repurchase Mandate Resolution (“Repurchase Mandate”). The Company is required, by the provisions of the Listing Rules regulating such securities repurchases and by Section 49BA(3) of the Companies Ordinance, to send to the Shareholders an explanatory statement containing all the information reasonably necessary to enable them to make an informed decision on whether to vote for or against the Repurchase Mandate Resolution. Such information is set out in Appendix I to this circular.

Concerning the Repurchase Mandate Resolution, the Directors wish to state that they have no immediate plans to repurchase any existing Shares.

### **PROPOSED RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS**

In accordance with Article 91 of the Articles of Association of the Company (“Articles of Association”), the Directors retiring by rotation at the 2012 AGM are Messrs Tang Shouchun, Lam Yau Fung Curt and Lau Hon Chuen Ambrose. In accordance with Article 97 of the Articles of Association, Mr. Chen Zhihong shall also be retiring at the 2012 AGM. All of them, being eligible, will offer themselves for re-election at the 2012 AGM. Details of the above Directors, which are required to be disclosed by the Listing Rules, are set out in Appendix III to this circular.

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### ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The 2012 AGM Notice is set out in Appendix II to this circular.

Whether or not you are able to attend the 2012 AGM, you are requested to complete and return the enclosed form of proxy for the 2012 AGM in accordance with the instructions printed thereon to the Company's share registrar, Tricor Abacus Limited at 26/F., Tesbury Centre, 28 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong, as soon as possible and in any event not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for the holding of the 2012 AGM or any adjourned meeting thereof. Completion and return of the form of proxy will not preclude you from attending and voting at the 2012 AGM or any adjournment thereof should you so wish.

Pursuant to Rule 13.39 of the Listing Rules, all votes of the Shareholders at the general meeting must be taken by poll.

### RECOMMENDATION

This explanatory statement also constitutes the memorandum as required under section 49BA(3) of the Companies Ordinance.

## **SHARE CAPITAL**

Whilst the Directors do not presently intend to repurchase any Shares, they believe that the flexibility afforded by the proposed Repurchase Mandate would be beneficial to the Company.

It is proposed that the Directors be authorised to repurchase up to 10 per cent of the aggregate Shares in issue at the date of the passing of the resolution to approve the general mandate. As at 23 April 2012, the latest practicable date for determining such figures (“Latest Practicable Date”), 9,285,258,657 Shares were in issue. Assuming that no further Shares are issued prior to the date of the 2012 AGM, the Directors would be authorised to repurchase up to approximately 928,525,865 Shares during the period up to the next annual general meeting of the Company in 2013 or the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required by law to be held or the revocation or variation of the Repurchase Mandate by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders in general meeting of the Company, whichever occurs first.

## **REASONS FOR REPURCHASES**

Repurchases of Shares will only be made when the Directors believe that such a repurchase will benefit the Company and the shareholders. Such repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net value of the Company and its assets and/or its earnings per Share.

## **FUNDING OF REPURCHASES**

Repurchases pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be financed entirely from the Company’s available cash flow or working capital facilities. Any repurchases will be made out of funds of the Company legally permitted to be utilised in this connection in accordance with its memorandum and articles of association and the laws of Hong Kong, including profits otherwise available for distribution. Under the Companies Ordinance, a company’s profits available for distribution are its accumulated, realised profits, so far as not previously utilised by distribution or capitalisation, less its accumulated, realised losses, so far as not previously written off in a reduction or reorganisation of capital duly made.

## **EFFECT OF ANY REPURCHASES**

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital, or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in its most recent published financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2011) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

**DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS**

None of the Directors, and to the best of their knowledge, having made all reasonable enquiries, none of their associates, have any present intention, if the Repurchase Mandate is exercised, to sell any Shares to the Company.

No connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company, or have undertaken not to do so, if the Repurchase Mandate is granted.

**DIRECTORS' UNDERTAKING**

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that, so far as the same may be applicable, they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules and the applicable laws of Hong Kong.

**SHARE REPURCHASE MADE BY THE COMPANY**

No repurchase of Shares has been made by the Company during the last six months (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise).

**TAKEOVERS CODE CONSEQUENCES**

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares a shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase will be treated as an acquisition for the purpose of the Hong Kong Code on Takeovers and Mergers ("Takeovers Code"). As a result, a shareholder, or group of shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the shareholder's interest, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. As at the Latest Practicable Date, Guangzhou Yue Xiu Holdings Limited owned approximately 49.88 per cent of the existing issued share capital of the Company. In the event that the Directors should exercise in full the power to repurchase Shares which is proposed to be granted to the Directors pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate, the shareholding of Guangzhou Yue Xiu Holdings Limited would (assuming that there is no change in relevant circumstances) be increased to approximately 55.4 per cent of the issued share capital of the Company. Such increase may give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors have no present intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent as would result in takeover obligations.

Mr Lau is the Senior Partner of Messrs. Chu & Lau, Solicitors & Notaries and is currently a Standing Committee Member of the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference. Mr Lau is currently an independent non-executive director of Franshion Properties (China) Limited (Stock Code: 817), Glorious Sun Enterprises Limited (Stock Code: 393), Yuexiu Transport Infrastructure Limited (Stock Code: 1052), Qin Jia Yuan Media Services Company Limited (Stock Code: 2366), The Hong Kong Parkview Group Limited (Stock Code: 207), Wing Hang Bank, Limited (Stock Code: 302) and Brightoil Petroleum (Holdings) Limited (Stock Code: 933). The shares of the companies

mentioned above are listed on the Stock Exchange. He is also a Director of Bank of China Group Insurance Company Limited, BOC Group Life Assurance Company Limited, Nanyang Commercial Bank, Limited, Chu & Lau Nominees Limited, Sun Hon Investment And Finance Limited, Wydoff Limited and Wytex Limited. Mr Lau served as the Chairman of the Central and Western District Board between 1988 and 1994, the President of the Law Society of Hong Kong in 1992-1993, a Member of the Bilingual Laws Advisory Committee between 1988 and 1997 and a Member of the Legislative Council of Hong Kong from 1995 to 2004 (between 1997 and 1998 he was a member of the Provisional Legislative Council). Save as disclosed above, Mr Lau has not held any directorships in other listed public companies in the last three years. Mr Lau does not have any relationship with any other directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company. Mr Lau has a personal interest of 3,640,000 shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

There is no service contract between the Company and Mr Lau and he will be subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at general meetings of the Company in accordance with the Articles of Association of the Company. The director's fee of Mr Lau as an independent non-executive director of the Company was RMB180,000 for the year ended 31 December 2011 with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company.
